



Dr. Stephaun E. Wallace is a research epidemiologist, public health and business consultant, and an internationally recognized public health/social justice leader. He has more than two decades of global experience in public health and human services (HIV/AIDS and other infectious diseases) and social justice efforts, and more than a decade of experience conducting public health research in global settings. Dr. Wallace is the Founder and Principal of Stephaun Elite Wallace, LLC, an innovation incubator consulting firm that conducts organizational development and public health focused programming nationally through a social justice lens. Dr. Wallace leads the firm's efforts to fulfil client requests/projects, enhance community relationships, and expand its client base. He views public health work through a social justice lens to understand how population-level health is affected by structural and social factors like stigma, racism, sexism, historical trauma and inequalities in education and income. He has managed multimillion-dollar budgets, secured millions of dollars in resources through grants and fundraising to support public health education, and participated in over \$80 million dollars of public health funded research. Dr. Wallace holds membership in, and serves on the board of, numerous regional, national, and international organizations including the International AIDS Society, American Public Health Association, American Bar Association, National Society of Leadership and Success, and the House of Blahnik, Inc.
